St Vitus Dance - Matthew Donnelly

Matthew Donnelly studied composition at Wilfrid Laurier University with well-known Canadian composers Dr Glen Buhr and Linda Caitlin Smith. In 2013, he was awarded the Canadian Band Association's annual composition prize for *River Valley Sketches*. In 2017, he was the recipient of an Ontario Art Council grant for his chamber orchestra work, *The Grave-digger's Waltz*.

Much of Matthew's music is inspired by folk tales and ghost stories (especially those of M.R. James and Eleanor Scott) and has been described numerous times as "Tim Burton-esque".

St Vitus Dance is the tale of a young boy from a medieval Roman town. He awakes one night to see a group of dark-robed figures parading through the streets, and follows them. They travel out of town to a secluded wooded area where bonfires are lit around a statue of St Vitus, the patron saint of dancers. The figures proceed to have a wild bacchanal before eventually drifting off into the night. The next day, the boy realizes that the figures he saw the night before are the townsfolk: merchants, teachers and even his neighbors. What exactly did he see in the that wood: a simple spring harvest ritual, or perhaps something darker?



Arthur Honegger was a Swiss composer, born in France, who made notable contributions to opera, ballet, choral music and orchestral music. Honegger was a member of Les Six, a famous group of six composers (Honegger, Auric, Durey, Milkhaud, Poulenc, Tailleferre) who lived and worked in Montparnasse at the time.

The principal elements of Honegger's style are Bachian counterpoint, driving rhythms, melodic amplitude, highly colouristic harmonies, an impressionistic use of orchestral sonorities, and a concern for formal architecture.

Pastorale d'été is a short symphonic poem for chamber orchestra, inspired by Honegger's vacation in the Swiss Alps in 1920. The work is atmospheric, placid and restrained; a musical impression of a peaceful early morning in the Swiss Alps. An epigraph by the influential French poet Arthur Rimbaud sets the mood for this poem: "J'ai embrasse l'abe d'ete." ("I have embraced the summer dawn."

Pavane -Gabriel Fauré



Gabriel Fauré was a French composer, organist, pianist and teacher. He was one of the foremost composers of his generation and his musical style influenced many 20th century composers.

Fauré's music has been described as linking the end of Romaticism with the modernism of the 20th century. When he was born, Chopin was still composing, and by the time of Fauré's death, jazz was being heard. Although he had deep respect for the traditional forms of music, Fauré delighted in infusing those forms with a melange of harmonic daring and a freshness of invention, including daring harmonic progressions and sudden modulations.

Pavane is a short work originally written for piano, and later adapted for orchestra. The work is named after the slow processional Spanish court dance of the same name. *Pavane* is celebrated for its slow harmonic movement, light orchestration and gentle atmosphere.

Scherzo in D minor -Sergei Rachmaninoff

Sergei Vasilyevich Rachmaninoff was a Russian-American composer, virtuoso pianist and conductor. Rachmaninoff is widely considered one of the finest pianists of his day and, as a composer, one of the last great representatives of Romanticism in Russian classical music.

Rachmaninoff's music is notable for its song-like melodicism, expressiveness and rich orchestral colours. Author Michael Kennedy noted that Rachmaninoff had "a gift for long and broad melodies imbued with a resigned melancholy that is never long absent."

Scherzo is Rachmaninoff's earliest surviving composition for orchestra, composed when he was a student at the Moscow Conservatory. The manuscript is dated 5-21 February 1888, when Rachmaninoff was only 14. Scherzo's lively melodies will have listeners dancing in their seats and humming the theme for days.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was a prolific and influential composer of the Classical period, widely recognized as one of the greatest composers in the history of Western music.

Despite his short life, Mozart's rapid pace of composition resulted in more than 800 works of virtually every genre of his time. Many of these compositions are acknowledged as pinnacles of the symphonic, concertante, chamber, operatic and choral repertoire. Mozart's music stands as an archetype of the Classical style.

Symphony no. 41 (or Jupiter Symphony) is known for its good humour, exuberant energy, and unusually grand scale for a symphony of the Classical period. These qualities likely earned the symphony its nickname "Jupiter" for the chief god of the ancient Roman pantheon. The Jupiter Symphony is the largest and most complex of Mozart's symphonies and, arguably, among the finest symphonies ever composed.


